

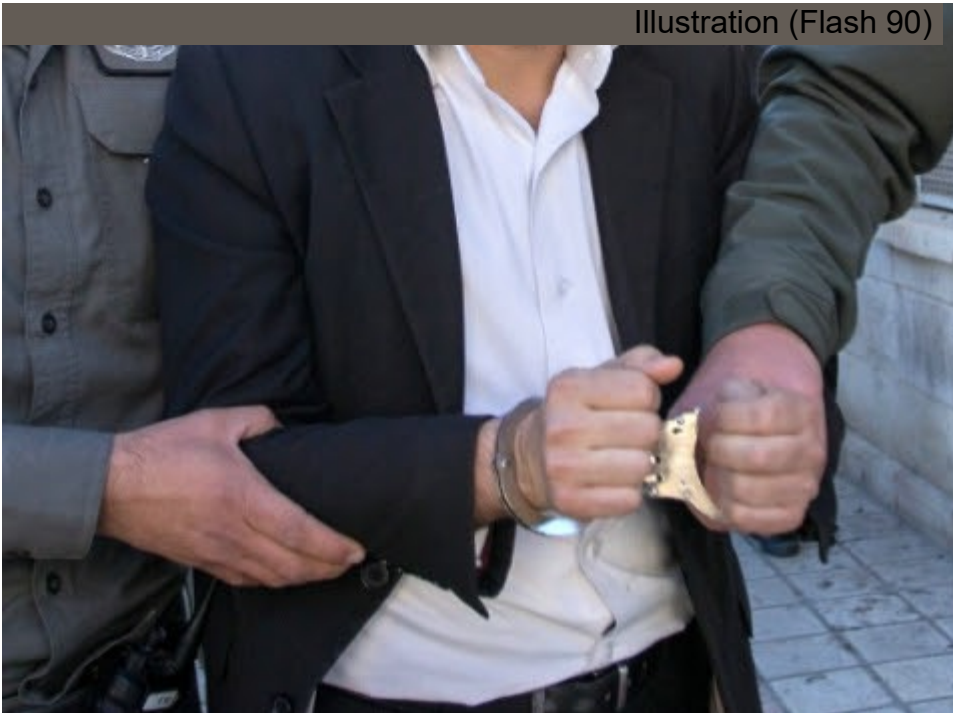

A sigh of relief in Bnei Brak: A serial childhood attacker was arrested and charged for

the third time

A week after being charged again - this time with the attack on his neighbor - Israel Sharabi, a serial girl who was attacked in the city, was recently arrested and charged with assaulting a 12-year-old girl • All details

And a week after he was charged again - this time with the attack on his neighbor - the serial girl from Bnei Brak was recently arrested and charged with assaulting a 12-year-old girl in the city.

It is Israel Sharabi, a 29-year-old resident of Bnei Brak, who for the third time attacked women and girls and his detention was extended by the Tel Aviv District Court to a different decision. It should be noted that members of his family object and renounce his actions.

According to the details received by Behadrei Haredim, as early as 2011, Sharabi was convicted of attacking her child and of other attacks. As a result, he was sentenced to more than two years in prison, but this did not deter him from carrying out the same acts.

On July 20, he was charged with harassment and assaulting his neighbor on several occasions. In a hearing held at the Tel Aviv Magistrate's Court, the Defendant was informed that he was being released until the end of the legal proceedings against him, but he must refrain from contact with minors and stay with them for 18 months, but before the ink had dried on the court's decision, Sharabi violated the decision.

According to the indictment filed three weeks ago, Sharabi approached a 12-year-old girl on a number of occasions and tried to coax her into talking to him but she refused and ignored him.

About a month ago, the 12-year-old girl, a resident of Bnei Brak, visited a relative who lives near Sharabi's home. When he noticed her, he began to follow her to her home. The girl noticed my hunger and fled to the stairway toward her house. He chased her and attacked her brutally. Only after she

shouted "There's a policeman in the building" did he escape.

Judge David Rosen said that according to the State Attorney's Office's statement, "this is not a matter of a person who can be called a 'retard' according to the law," and later Judge Gilia Ravid extended his detention Until another decision is made.
