Louis Steven Verdugo, domestic violence/aggravated assault, four years probation and 150 hours of community service, fined \$1,641, Judge Leslie Miller.

Jose Luis Villa Jr., unlawful possession of a dangerous drug – methamphetamine, four years probation, fined \$3,140, Judge Robert B. Donfeld.

Kevin Michael Webb, robbery, 165 days in jail followed by four years probation, Judge Robert B. Donfeld.

Lorenzo Saiz Gonzales, aggravated driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor while license is suspended, canceled, revoked or refused or in violation of a restriction, four months in prison followed by 12 months in jail, with a credit of 30 days for time served, followed by three years probation, Judge John E. Davis.

Dana Shane Roberts, molestation of a child, 12 years in prison followed by two years community supervision, Judge John E. Davis.

William Bruner Jr., attempted unlawful possession of a narcotic drug for sale – cocaine, 30 days in jail followed by up to 90 days of electronic monitoring, Judge John E. Davis.

Jorge Gutierrez Gonzalez, theft by controlling stolen property, two years in prison, Judge Charles S. Sabalos.

Glenda Joyce Graham, unlawful possession of a prescription drug, three years probation, Judge Richard D. Nichols.

Louie Joe Hall, solicitation to unlawful possession of a dangerous drug – lysergic acid diethylamide, three years probation, fined \$3,140, Judge Robert B. Donfeld.

Gilbert Federico Navarro, solicitation to unlawful possession of a narcotic drug – cocaine, three years probation, fined \$3,140, Judge Charles S. Sabalos.

William Alexander Newell, conspiracy to commit unlawful sale of a narcotic drug – cocaine; and money laundering in the second degree, seven years probation, fined \$6,280, Judge John Kelly.

Vernon Edward Peltz, endangerment; criminal damage, three years probation, Judge Robert B. Donfeld.

Victor Javier Quintero, two counts of attempted burglary, 2.5 years in prison followed by eight years probation, fined \$2,315, Judge John E. Davis.

Richard Lozano Rae, solicitation to unlawful possession of a narcotic drug – cocaine, three years probation, Judge Charles S. Sabalos.

Gabriel Ruiz, two counts of burglary, 2.5 years in prison with a credit of 202 days for time served, followed by four months community supervision, Judge John E. Davis.

Karen Marie Russell, solicitation to possess a narcotic drug – heroin, three years probation and 200 hours of community service, fined \$2,900, Judge John F. Kelly.

Shawn Michael Waldeck, burglary in the second degree, 2.5 years in prison with a credit of 280 days for time served, followed by four months community supervision, Judge John S. Leonardo.

Loretha Woods, unlawful possession/use of drug paraphernalia, one year in prison, Judge Robert Donfeld.

Jesse James Doe, violation of probation previously imposed for conspiracy to possess a narcotic drug for sale – cocaine, two years in jail with a credit of 107 days for time served, and probation extended, Judge Charles S. Sabalos.

Kimberly Dorsett Findley, violation of probation previously imposed for unlawful possession of a dangerous drug – methamphetamine, 2.5 years in prison with a credit of 140 days for time served, Judge Margaret M. Houghton.

Spencer M. Antone, violation of probation previously imposed for burglary in the second degree, 3.5 years in prison with a credit of 259 days for time served, Judge Margaret M. Houghton.

Francisco Juaquin Sotelo, violation of probation previously imposed for facilitation to commit burglary, continued under the intensive probation program, Judge Howard Hantman.

James Edward Quigley, resisting arrest, six months in prison with a credit of 76 days for time served, followed by 26 days community supervision, Judge Howard Hantman.

Darius Doyle Ross, public sexual indecency to a minor under 15, six years in prison with a credit of 127 days for time served, followed by 10 months community supervision, Judge Howard Hantman.

Edmundo Valdez, attempt to unlawful possession of marijuana, two years in prison with a credit of 53 days for time served, Judge Howard Hantman.

Phillip W. Waller, violation of probation previously imposed for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, continued on probation with up to 90 days electronic monitoring, Judge Deborah Bernini.

Jeremy Shane Hanson, solicitation to unlawful possession of a dangerous drug – methamphetamine, three years probation, fined \$1,000, Judge Deborah Bernini.

Richard John Schwartz, violation of probation previously imposed for attempted molestation of a child, probation extended five years with up to 90 days of electronic monitoring, Judge Charles Sabalos.

Glenda Joyce Graham, violation of probation previously imposed for shoplifting, probation extended three years, Judge Richard D. Nichols.

Jeremy Randall Levine, burglary; arson of a structure, four years probation, fined \$1 million, Judge Philip Fahringer.

William J. Sims, burglary, three years intensive probation, Judge Richard D. Nichols.

Raymond Eugene Osborne, violation of probation, 110 days in jail and probation extended, Judge Leslie Miller.

Ryan Phillip Ruiz, violation of probation previously imposed for solicitation to unlawful possession of narcotic drug – cocaine, one year in prison with a credit of 86 days for time served, fined \$1,177, Judge Leslie Miller.

David Lee Vaughn, violation of probation previously imposed for indecent exposure to a minor under 15, continued under probation, Judge Gilbert Veliz.

Estevan Tiznado, conspiracy to unlawful possession of marijuana for sale, 45 days in jail followed by four years probation, fined \$3,140, Judge Raner C. Collins.

Linda Altamirano Ward, child abuse, 180 days in jail followed by three years probation and 85 hours of community service, Judge Raner C. Collins.

Juan Pablo De La Rosa, theft by control of property, three years probation, Judge John E. Davis.

Kara Lynn Mills, unlawful possession of marijuana, one year probation and 24 hours community service, fined \$750, Judge John S. Leonardo.

Brian Clifton Bass, three counts of unlawful sale of a narcotic drug, two years in prison, followed by 104 days community supervision; unlawful sale of a narcotic drug, three years probation, fined \$3,140, Judge John S. Leonardo.

Andres Ruiz Solano, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon – a handgun, 3.5 years in prison with a credit of 122 days for time served, followed by six months community supervision, Judge Deborah Bernini.

Robert Matthew Weingart, driving while under the influence of liquor, drugs, vapor releasing substances or any combination, one year probation, fined \$342, Judge John E. Davis.

Hillel Abramson, violation of probation previously imposed for sexual conduct with a minor under the age of 15, 14 years in prison with a credit of 269 days for time served, Judge Richard D. Nichols.

Robby Ziyad Aranki, violation of probation previously imposed for theft by misrepresentation, 45 days in jail under the shock incarceration program and if eligible 120 days in prison, fined \$4,674, Judge Margaret M. Houghton.

Samuel Lockas Garza Jr., violation of probation previously imposed for driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, drugs or vapor releasing substances, probation extended until Jan. 2, 1998, Judge Margaret M. Houghton

Monica R. Sandoval, violation of probation previously imposed for conspiracy to sell a narcotic drug, probation extended until March 23, 1996, Judge Howard Hantman.

Martin Frasuquillo, violation of probation previously imposed for conspiracy to possess marijuana for sale, 3.75 years in prison with a credit of 295 days for time served, fined \$2,900, Judge Charles S. Sabalos.
